
Slow learner and Advance learner

Each type of students has different learning attitudes and learning habits. A faculty must adapt a teaching methodology such that he/she may not lose the attention of the slow learners and turn off the advanced learners.

The purpose of assessment of the learning levels of the students and conduction of activities for them is

- · Identification of the slow learners and advanced learners in the class

Guest Speaker: **Dr. Pundikai Ganappayya Bhat** (Rtd. Professor in Ancient History and Archaeology, Sri Dhavala College, Moodbidri)



Dr. Pundikai Ganappayya Bhat began his talk with the brief introduction about the history of Tulunadu historiography. He stated that the first people to construct the history of this place were the local writers during the beginning of the 20th century. The professional historians entered into this scene rather slowly, around the 1930s, maybe with the breakthrough done by the work of B. A. Saletore. The major theme of this webinar lecture was to throw light on the works and efforts of local historians before the entry of the professional historians in this field. He refers to the life and works of Polali Sheenappa Hegde, Ganapathi Rao Aigal and finally Manjeshwar Govinda Pai. 

Speaker: Dr. Shivatarak K. B. (Rtd. Professor in History, Ancient History and Archaeology, St. Mary's Syrian College, Brahmavar)



DR. Shivatarak K. B. began his lecture with a brief introduction about pre-historic period and its divisions such as Palaeolithic period, Mesolithic period and Neolithic period. He further associates these pre-historic ages to the history of Tulunadu. He also discussed about various stages throughout Karnataka, amounting to 4787 sites. He gave a detailed description of the total number of pre-historical settlements found in different taluks of Udupi district. He also analysed the total number of pre-historic settlements in Dakshina Kannada district and spoke about the various implements, cultural finds, and other archaeological artefacts finds in these places. He has also given information about pre-historic caves and petrographs in this region. He further gives information about the beginning of the historical period. He states that Saletore wrote his works after going through various inscriptions. B. A. Saletore published his book *World Tribals in Indian History* in 1935. Saletore has mentioned the koragas of Tulunadu and stated that "they were the very first community of Tulunadu." He provided a very detailed information about the rulers of Tulunadu. Shri. T. Murugeshi began the session with a brief description of various scholars who have contributed in the reconstruction of the history of Tulunadu. He then moves to the topic, i.e., The Political History of the Alupas. He begins with the various sources in which information of this dynasty is available. According to the speaker Halmidi inscriptions, was among the first to have mentioned about the Alupas, it mentions it as 'alapa-gana'. The inscription also mentions about the various lords of this gana or republic, their genealogy, the wars and political conditions, etc. The speaker states that there is some sort of cliché in their history. There haven't been proper familial links established among the lords. He also gives a list of names of the Alupa kings and brief description of their rule. He states that, there is some scarcity of sources backing this dynasty and making it difficult to reconstruct a solid history for them. He explains how the present-day matriarchal society in and around Dakshina Kannada and Kasaragod can be kept as a basis of study of history of Tulunadu, as this practice is something



Dr. Peter Wilson Prabhakar, the guest speaker for this programme said that the Basel mission was founded in 1815 at Basil town in Switzerland by Rev. Broomard, Rev. Vonbroom and eight others. It came to the west coast of India in 1834. The headquarters of the Basal mission was established at Balamatta. The Basal mission started the first Anglo- Vernacular school, nursery schools, infant schools, primary, middle schools, night schools and also teacher training schools. It's started its first printing press and publication house at Mangalore in 1841. It also brought out the first Kannada newspaper 'Mangaluru Samachar' in 1843. The most prominent contribution to Kannada language and literature was rendered by Rev. Kittel of the Basel Mission Dr. Anasuya Rai (Principal, UCM) presided over this programme. Department has organised several special lectures on different topics like Polymer technology, Kitchen Chemistry etc. in which students get the opportunity to interact with the experts.




Mr. Pradeep Soori: Pradeep Soori, a retired bank officer is an enthusiastic agriculturist, practicing organic farming.

Documentaries and Short Films:


Objectives






- To give them an opportunity to learn the basic concepts and applications of chemistry in day to day life.
