## Multiple reflection mirrors

Multiple reflection of light is the reflection of light back and forth several times between reflecting surfaces. A set of two mirrors has 5 reflections. General Rule. If the angle between two mirrors is a factor of 360 (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 12, 15, 18, 20, 24, 30, 36, 40, 45, 60, 72, 90, 120, 180, 360), then the total number of reflections is finite and is computed as 360 divided by the angle minus 1. When two mirrors are parallel to each other, the number of reflections is infinite



## Aragos wheel

In this device, a copper disk is rotated rapidly with a hand crank and a step-up pulley system. Balanced on a pivot above the center of the disk is a compass needle. The motion of the needle relative to the highly conducting copper disk induces eddy currents in the disk. In turn, these eddy currents produce a torque on the magnetic needle, which starts to rotate. The presence of eddy currents may be inferred from the fact that a copper disk with radial slots cut in it produces little effect; the slots interrupt the eddy currents.

The inverse effect also occurs: a spinning bar magnet will cause a suspended copper disk to rotate. The French physicist, Dominique Arago (1786-1853) discovered this effect in 1825 while studying the observation that the proximity of a piece of copper to a compass needle reduces the effect of the earth's magnetic field on the needle.



## Dip circle

Georg Hartmann first discovered dip angle in 1544. Dip circle is a device used to measure the angle of dip at a place. It consists of a magnetic needle pivoted at the centre of the vertical circular scale that can rotate in the plane of the scale about the horizontal axis passing through its C.G.The Dip Needle is a compass pivoted to move in the plane containing the magnetic field vector of the earth. It will then show the angle which the magnetic field makes with the vertical. The needle must be accurately balanced so that only magnetic torques are exerted on it.Angle of dip is maximum at the poles.



## Biots apparatus

To demonstrate practically the distribution of electricity on the surface of a conductor, the following apparatus was contrived by Biot. A sphere of conductucting matter is [placed on an insulating rod], and two thin hollow covers, of brass or copper, are provided with glass handles, and correspond to the shape and magnitude of the conductor. The sphere is electrified, and the covers are then applied, being held by the glass handles. After withdrawing them from [the sphere], they are found to be charged with the same kind of electricity as was communicated to [the sphere], which will be found to have lost the whole of its charge, proving that it resided on the surface only. Jean-Baptiste Biot (1774-1862) is best known to physicists for his work on the Biot-Savart law (1820), the first description of the magnetic force exerted by a wire on a small permanent magnet.



## WimshurstMachine

The Wimshurst influence machine is an electrostatic generator, a machine for generating high voltages developed between 1880 1883 and by British inventor James Wimshurst (1832-1903). The machine is theoretically not self-starting, meaning that if none of the sectors on the discs has any electrical charge there is nothing to induce charges on other sectors. In practice, even a small residual charge on any sector is enough to start the process going once the discs start to rotate. The machine will only work satisfactorily in a dry atmosphere. It requires mechanical power to turn the disks against the electric field, and it is this energy that the machine converts into the electric power of the spark. The steady state output of the Wimshurst machine is a direct (nonalternating) current that is proportional to the area covered by the metal sector, the rotation speed, and a complicated function of the initial charge distribution. The insulation and the size of the machine determine the maximum output voltage that can be reached. The available voltage gain can be understood by noting that the charge density on oppositely charged sectors, between the neutralizer bars, is nearly uniform across the sectors, and thus at low voltage, while the charge density on same charged sectors, approaching the collector combs, peaks near the sector edges, at a consequently high voltage relative to the opposite collector combs.



## **Universal Heliostat**

A heliostat (from *helios*, the Greek word for *sun*, and *stat*, as in stationary) is a device that includes a mirror, usually a <u>plane mirror</u>, which turns so as to keep reflecting sunlight toward a predetermined target, compensating for the sun's apparent motions in the sky. Nowadays, most heliostats are used for <u>day lighting</u> or for the production of <u>concentrated solar power</u>, usually to generate electricity. They are also sometimes used in <u>solar cooking</u>. A few are used experimentally, or to reflect motionless beams of sunlight into <u>solar telescopes</u>. Before the availability of <u>lasers</u> and other electric lights, heliostats were widely used to produce intense, stationary beams of light for scientific and other purposes.



## **Newton's Disc**

The "Newton disc" also known as Disappearing Colour Disc is a well-known physics experiment with a rotating disc with segments in different colors (usually Newton's primary colors: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet) appearing as white (or off-white or gray) when it spins very fast, type of mix of light stimuli is called temporal optical mixing, a version of additive-averaging mixing. The concept that human visual perception cannot distinguish details of high-speed movements is popularly known as persistence of vision.



## **Force Pump**

A force pump is a **pump** with a solid piston for drawing and forcing through valves a liquid (such as water) to a considerable height above the **pump** or under a considerable pressure.

In a **force pump**, the upstroke of the piston draws water, through an inlet valve, into the cylinder. On the downstroke, the water is discharged, through an outlet valve, into the outlet pipe. A **pump** with a solid piston and valves **used** to raise a liquid or expel it under pressure.





Fig. 11.3. The Force pump

## **Locomotive Engine**

A locomotive or engine is a <u>rail transport vehicle</u> that provides the <u>motive power</u> for a train.

Locomotives may generate their power from fuel (wood, coal, petroleum or natural gas), or they may take power from an outside source of electricity. It is common to classify locomotives by their source of energy. The common ones include:Steam, Internal combustion,Kerosene, Petrol, Diesel, Diesel-mechanical, Diesel-electric



# Percussion Apparatus (Wave pendulum, Newton's Cradle )

Newton's cradle is a device that demonstrates conservation of momentum and energy using a series of swinging spheres. When one sphere at the end is lifted and released, it strikes the stationary spheres, transmitting a force through the stationary spheres that pushes the last sphere upward. The last sphere swings back and strikes the still nearly stationary spheres, repeating the effect in the opposite direction. The device is named after 17th-century English scientist Sir Isaac Newton. A typical Newton's cradle consists of a series of identically sized metal balls suspended in a metal frame so that they are just touching each other at rest. Each ball is attached to the frame by two wires of equal length angled away from each other. This restricts the pendulums' movements to the same plane.



## Galvanometer


A galvanometer is an <u>electromechanical</u> instrument used for detecting and indicating an <u>electric current</u>. A galvanometer works as an <u>actuator</u>, by producing a rotary deflection (of a "pointer"), in response to electric current flowing through a <u>coil</u> in a constant <u>magnetic field</u>. Modern galvanometers, of the D'Arsonval/Weston type, are constructed with a small pivoting coil of wire, called a spindle, in the field of a permanent magnet. The coil is attached to a thin pointer that traverses a calibrated scale. A tiny torsion spring pulls the coil and pointer to the zero position. When a <u>direct current</u> (DC) flows through the coil, the coil generates a magnetic field. This field acts against the permanent magnet. The coil twists, pushing against the spring, and moves the pointer. The hand points at a scale indicating the electric current. Careful design of the pole pieces ensures that the magnetic field is uniform, so that the angular deflection of the pointer is proportional to the current.


## Wind bar Chime

Wind chimes are a type of <u>percussion instrument</u> constructed from suspended <u>tubes</u>, rods, <u>bells</u> or other objects that are often made of metal or wood. The tubes or rods are suspended along with some type of weight or surface which the tubes or rods can strike when they or another wind-catching surface are blown by the <u>natural movement of air</u> outside. They are usually hung outside of a building or residence as a visual and aural <u>garden ornament</u>. Since the percussion instruments are struck according to the random effects of the wind blowing the chimes, wind chimes have been considered an example of <u>chance-based music</u>. The tubes or rods may sound either indistinct pitches, or fairly distinct pitches. Wind chimes that sound fairly distinct pitches can, through the chance movement of air, create simple <u>melodies</u> or <u>broken chords</u>.




## Gyroscope

A gyroscope (from Ancient Greek "circle" and "to look") is a device used for measuring or maintaining orientation and angular velocity. It is a spinning wheel or disc in which the axis of rotation (spin axis) is free to assume any orientation by itself. When rotating, the orientation of this axis is unaffected by tilting or rotation of the mounting, according to the conservation of angular momentum.



## British weigh scale

A Beam balance (or Beam scale) is a device to measure weight or mass. These are also known as mass scales, weight scales, mass balances, weight balances, or simply scales, balances, or balance scales. It is easy to read your weight on a digital scale, but the older models of physician \$\pmu #039\$; scales, called "beam balance scales," require you to do a little work and a tiny bit of math. These scales work on the lever principle. The beam of the balance is fixed on a pivot. You move weights along one side of the beam until it balances and is level. When the beam is level, the position of the weights shows your weight.








#### 2018-19

# Department of Botany

#### Field visits

A field visit is very helpful for supplementing the theoretical knowledge. It helps to interlink the facts with the practical field. It creates interest among the students to know more about the environment.

Pilikula arboretum: It is located at about 15 kms away from Mangalore city. Plants from Western ghats are
conserved in this arboretum. Ex-situ conservation of plants is the main motto. Many endangered and exotic tree species
are grown here. Many medicinal plants are also cultivated here. Students get the knowledge about ex situ conservation
and biodiversity of plants.



- Pilikula biological park: Many garden plants are cultivated here. Some tree species act as habitats for many birds and animals. Many animals are kept in the zoo. Different species of snakes, birds, turtles etc. are nurtured here.
- 3. Pilikula museum: It has wide collection of seeds and wood of various tree species of western ghats. Value added products are exhibited in the museum. Dr. Soorya Prakash Shenoy, senior scientist of arboretum explained the various aspects of the museum.








4. Pilikula herbarium center: There is a wide collection of herbarium specimens. Scientist Mrs. Veena demonstrated the preparation of herbarium. A video clipping is also shown to the students regarding the collection and pressing of plant specimens. Students were educated to prepare herbarium.





- 6. Shobhavana: It is located at Mijar village of Moodbidri. Various types of medicinal values are cultivated here. Nakshathravana, raashivana etc. are scientifically developed in the garden. It is maintained by the Alva's Education foundation.
- 5. Soans farm: It is located at Moodbidri. Pinapple is the main cash crop here. Importance is given for the insituconservation of plants. Different varieties of bamboo are also cultivated. Though it was a home garden, because of its scientific management it is a learning spot for many students and environmentalists.



7. Manipal School of Life Sciences: It is an excellent research institute. It has well developed biotechnology, molecular biology, microbiology, pathology laboratories. Many sophisticated instruments and their working principles were demonstrated by the staff and research scholars of various departments.



8. CPCRI Kasargod: It is one of the central government research institutes. The main research here is on coconut, are canut, pepper and cocoa plants. Mixed cropping, vermicomposting, biowaste management etc. are practiced here. Mr. Panduranga, technical assistant from Krishi vijnanakendra demonstrated indoor and outdoor cultivation of mushrooms.



9. Butterfly Garden at Belvai, Moodbidri: It is developed and maintained by a young and enthusiastic environmentalist Mr. Sammilan Shetty. It has different varieties of butterflies and the host plants. Students could study the different stages in the lifecycle of butterflies and also their behavioral patterns. Role plants in the survival of butterflies were well described to the students.

10. Mr. Deva Rao's paddy fields and farm at Killur: He is a well-known agriculturist conserving more than 100 varieties of paddy in his fields. His son Mr. Parameshwara Rao is looking after the storage of different seed collections. His seed collections were exhibited during the exhibition on the occasion of 150th year celebration of our college.



11. Nagabanas: students visited various nagabanas and sacred groves in and around Mangalore taluk, Documented the plant species and also had a discussion with the localities about the traditions followed.





12. Estuary of Kanapu to study Mangroves. Kanapu area has many mangrove trees, Mangroves are natophytic plants well adapted to live in a saline habitat. Students could visualize Pneumatophores, stilt roots and vivipary.





13. Tree Park at Thannirbavi: Students could visualize the conservation of various local plants at the tree park. Also, could collect some dried specimens of halophytes from the beach.



14. Terrace Garden and hydroponics garden at hosabettu, Mangalore: Mr. Rajkumar and Mr. Pradeep Soori are practicing these techniques in their gardens. This is one of the good methods to grow plants in the limited available space and also to sustainable usage of water. Ms. Vasundhara one of the retired botany staff also has a garden of ornamental plants maintained without using any type of chemicals.

#### Nurturing the plants in the botanical garden


#### Lab events


# Department of Chemistry Quiz competition
