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

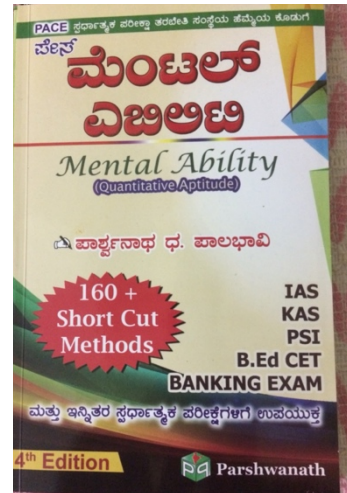

Objectives:

- To create awareness among the students about career prospects in the Banking sector.
- To enable them to appear for competitive examinations not only in the banking sector but also in various private and public undertakings.
- To enlighten and broaden students' intellects so as to make them better competitors.
- To impart training to sharpen their skills and other abilities required for their employment.

DAY 1: Saturday- 27th Oct. 2018

Session on Reasoning (Mental ability) and Analogy:

Balachandra dealt in detail on Number Analogy with different exercises, Coding and Decoding with different steps like Coding by Substitution, Coding by Skipping , Coding based on the position of alphabet, Coding by Mathematical Symbol, Direct Coding and Coding by Comparison and Sentence coding. Various examples and exercises were given to the students as home work. He also gave value and moral education to the students by practical examples and moral stories.

Day 3: Thursday 01th November 2018.
